WORLD STILL IN ROUGH, SAYS PROF.

Prof. T. M. Carver, Harvard Economist, Declares World is Yet Unfinished.

EVERYTHING IS ON

This is an unfinished world, said Prof. T. M. Carver of the chair of political economy of Harvard university, in a short talk at the noon luncheon of the University club.

"Things in this world are in the process of being tried out. Religious, systems of government, philosophies and systems of morality are all being weighed in the balance. If they are not good they will eventually go. We do not yet know that a democracy

is the best possible form of government. Democracy, too, is on trial. We are in the habit of taking it for granted that it is best because we like the idea of selfgovernment.
