ROURKES SUBDUE SLIPPING CHAMPS

Pa's Athletes Get Their Revenge on Coal Miner Grant and Chase Him from Box.

EVERYBODY CRACKS THE BALL

The frisky Isabellites, who battled our duke athletes to a fourteen-stanza deadlock Sunday and gave them a snap on the wrist by a 3 to 2 count Monday, were a subdued and behaved crew yesterday, with the result that the Rourkites allowed them to a joyous slaughter, 19 to 3.
