MOTHER'S day programs are the rule in women's clubs this week, as they have been during the last week. The Woman's club of the Railway Mail Service has a particularly attractive Mother's day program and the P. E. O. Sisterhood and Mothers' clubs are also observing the newest of national special days. It was the thought of local temperance workers to have the initiative petitions for prohibition filed with the secretary of state at Lincoln yesterday as a tribute to Mother's day, but the plan was not carried out as the petitions will be filed on Friday of this week instead.

This will be a busy week at the Young Women's Christian association. Every evening there will be exhibitions of gymnastics and folk dancing by the athletic department of the association, and beginning Thursday an important conference of employed workers of the association. One of the chief speakers will be Dr. James J. Brown of New York City, who is interested in the physical culture department. Secretaries from all over the district will attend.

The annual May breakfast of the Business Women's Club will be one of the largest affairs of Wednesday. The proceeds to be used to send delegates from this club to the conference at Geneva in the summer. The evening before the business girls will meet at the "Y" building to fix the tables and decorations for the breakfast next morning, which will be served between 7 and 9 o'clock. Each girl in charge of a large reservation takes pride in having her table present the most attractive appearance.

At All Saints church on Tuesday the thirteenth annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Episcopal churches of Nebraska will be held. Mrs. Philip Potter has headed this organization for twenty odd years.

For the end of the week the entertainment of the women delegates to the biennial convention of the General Federation of Women's Clubs in New York City during the few moments they are in the city, together with a beauty sendoff for the Nebraska delegation, is of paramount interest. A large number of local club women will be on hand to greet the newcomers and distribute souvenirs of Omaha. Mrs. J. N. Paul at St. Paul, president of the state federation, is authority for the statement that over fifty Nebraska women will attend the convention. Their headquarters will be at the Hotel Gayor.
