The speaker dwelt at great length on the part played by Senator Cum mins in the various political activities of recent years and reviewed in detail his acts as a member of the United States senate. He added: "We have a candidate with strength, wis-dom, character, and experience who has been a leader among his people, a man whose strength has been pended for the benefit of the whole country, Albert B. Cummins, and with united support the chances of this nomination will be greatly increased.


