KRUG'S MEN MAKE THEIR HITS COUNT

Rourke Accumulate Six Hits For as Many Runs, While Bears Make Twelve Hits for Four.

RUSSELL FORD MAKES START

For the third successive time the pesky Bears from the arid heights of Denver were administered a summary execution by the ferocious, blood-thirsty and violent Rourkevians yesterday, this time by a count of 6 to 4.

The ravenous Grizzlies, who by this time must be about starved to death, mad twice as many hits as Omaha did, but they didn't make 'em at the right time, which is one of the fundamentals in compiling base ball victories. Omaha only made six hits, but five of them were combed in the first three stanzas and were mixed up with generous bases on balls, while the Bears were scattered out through the nine rounds.

Russell can't use the emory any more so he uses a spitter which is mostly bluff. Krug walked to start the second round and Krueger beat out a bunt. Ernie is getting faster every day; he can now run almost as fast as an ice truck. Kilduff went out, but Shaq Thompson was on the job with a beautiful pinch blow through second which scored Marty and the mercury-hoofed Ernie.

No More Scoring.

Here Mr. Ford disguised himself as a Packard and his speed was too much for the Rourkeites, who didn't score again. But they didn't need to, the runs Mr. Thompson slogged over sufficed.

A hit and an error netted the Bears one in the second, four hits netted two more in the third and two hits one more in the sixth. Marty Krug saw visions of disaster and yanked Harry Krause for Freddy Buck, who proved a ready rescuer by holding the Grizzlies hitless the rest of the game. It might be mentioned, Freddy went in with one down and a man on second and third and retired the side very gracefully.
