

BIG STRIDES MARK BELLEVUE PROGRESS

Booster Club Organized to Boom Pretty Village—Many New Homes Built.

EXPECT SUMMER PATRONAGE

Bellevue citizens have organized a club, which is yet too immature to have received a name, for the purpose of boosting "beautiful Bellevue" as a residence town. The movement is being pushed by the new club, the charter members of which are William S. Shafer, chairman; Dr. William H. Betz, Mayor Paul Kepler, L. D. Erion, John Flynn, A. E. Dunn and C. B. Tower, by the Bellevue college authorities and with some help from the Commercial club of Omaha.

Beauty All Homes.

The club's main work will be to beautify the homes in the village, to keep the thickly wooded squares which dot the town in good condition, to improve water mains, to sell property and to furnish inducements for industrious people to make Bellevue their home.

Bellevue college is co-operating by offering its buildings for use as a summer resort. Some of the college buildings will be open for summer boarders. The swimming pool will be kept in condition for constant use. The cooks who are now in the college employ will be retained and in addition to regular meals for boarders will furnish automobile luncheons to motor parties. The advantages of a beautiful country resort in close access to the city are evident.

Nothing like it, it is said, is to be found in the country.

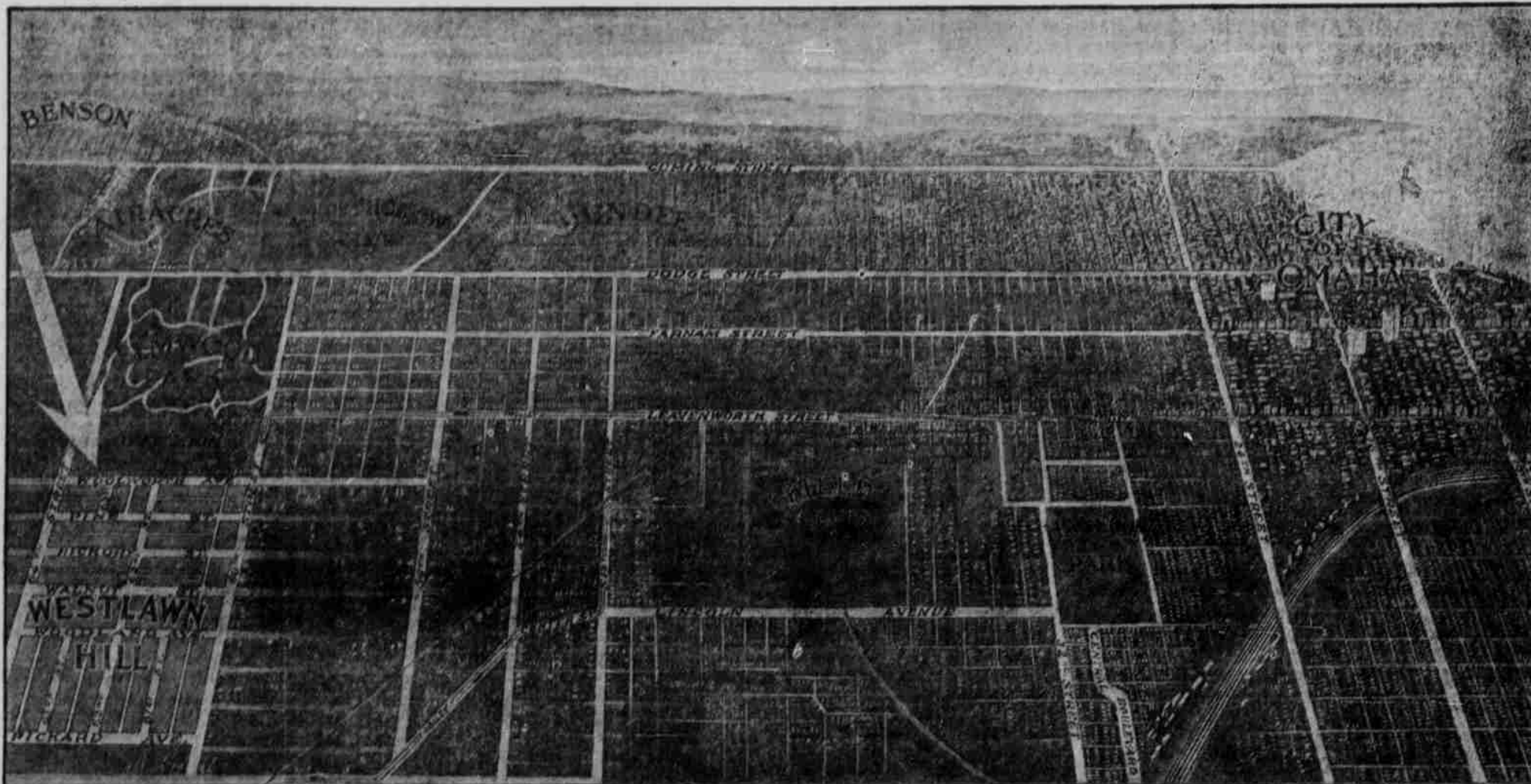
