SWITCHMAN CRUSHED TO DEATH WHEN CARS MEET

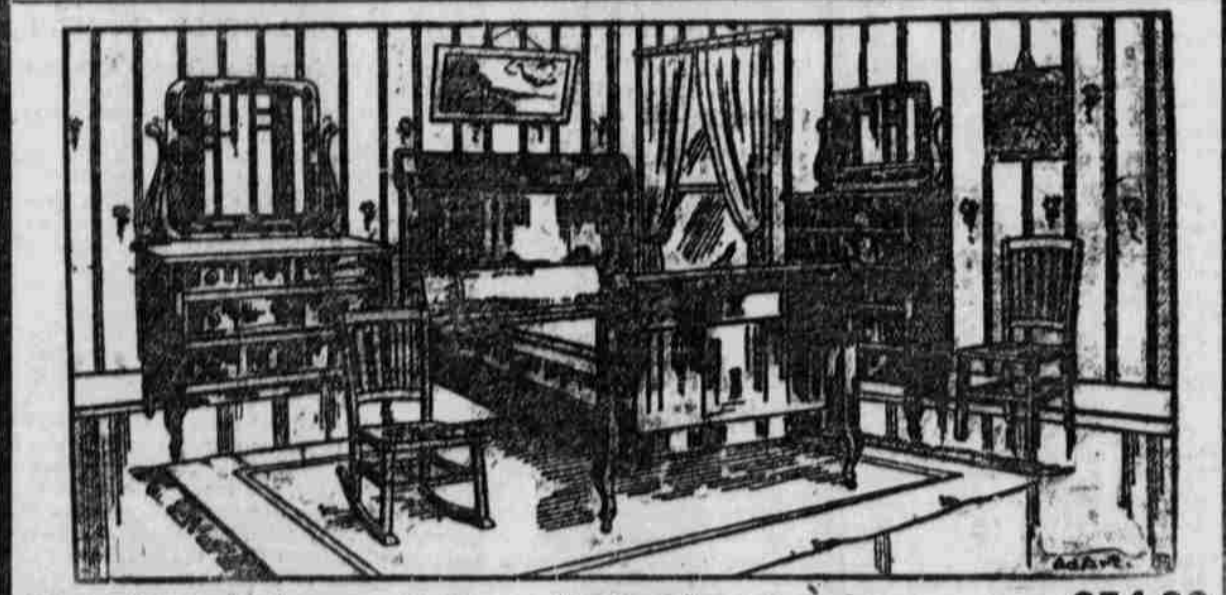
