

The money with which they now are provided was received from the sale of their farms to white pur-chasers after they had received the deeds from the government. As the government has no control over the sale of the lands since deeds were

transferred to the Indians, and as the noney belongs to the Indians themsolves, government officials can do nothing toward preventing the red-men from squandering their money for the white man's "devil wagons."




