## RUSS OFFENSIVE STILL CONTINUING

London, June 14 .- In Volhynia and Galicia the Russians are continuing two runners in the fourth inning, giv- Austro-Hungarians and Germans and on various sectons in both regions they have made fresh advances and captured additional prisoners and war

In Galicia the drive of the Russians has brought them across the Dniester river, where they have captured the towns of Zale Szczyky and Horo-donka, from which they are pressing forward toward the Pruth river and the Bukowina frontier with Czernowitz their objective.

Fighting Around Tarnopol.

Farther north violent fighting is taking place around Tarnopol, where the Austro-Hungarians, reinforced by Germans, are holding back the attempts of the Prussians to advance in the direction of Lemberg, capital of Galicia. Northeast of Tarnopol near Vorobievka, positions have changed hands repeatedly in the heavy fighting, while east of Kozloe, which lies southwest of Tarnopol, the capture of a Russian advanced post is reported by Vienna.

In Volhynia northwest and west of Lutsk, the Russians have driven out the Austrians near Rojitche and occupied the town of Torchin, while west of Kolki, north of Lutsk, the Austrians have again repulsed the Russians, who were attempting to cross the Etyr river, inflicting heavy losses on them.

Waukegan, Ill., June 20.—Dr. John L. Taylor, coroner, testified today at the trial of Will H. Orpet for the alleged murder of Marian Lambert that the cyanide of potassium which caused death was taken in liquid form. He based this statement on allegation that stains of the poison on Miss Lambert's person was sediment and not cyanide in crystal form.

The defense, it is said, will contend that Miss Lambert brought the corrosive in crystal form with her, probably wrapped in a bit of paper.

Dr. Taylor said stains of sediment, an impalpable powder, were on Miss Lambert's hands and in a streak from a corner of her mouth toward her forehead, as if left there by a trickle of liquid.
