FRENCHMAN PROPOSES TO CREATE MEDAL OF GRATITUDE. (Correspondence of the Associated Press.) Paris, June 1.—M. Briand, president of the cabinet and minister of foreign affairs, has presented a report to President Poincare proposing the creation of a "medal of gratitude" in recognition of services rendered voluntarily to France by subjects of foreign countries during the war.

Melbourne, Australia, June 1.—The federal and the state governments of Australia have authorized the foundation of a fund to be called "The Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Fund." It will enable those who have not been fighting for their country to fulfill their obligations by assisting soldiers to gain a permanent livelihood after the war.
