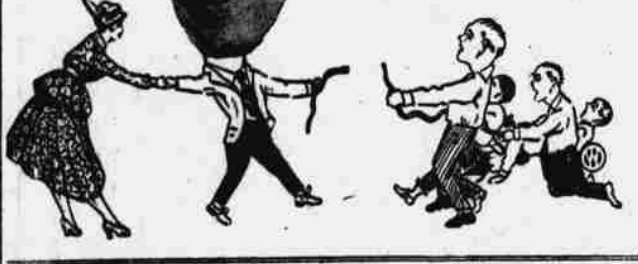

FUNSTON PREPARES TO GUARD BORDER

Guardsmen Coming from Texas Will Be Whipped Into Shape for Service.

THOUSAND UPON THE WAY. San Antonio, Tex., June 27.—With the regiments, officers and men ready for any sudden eventuality along the border, attention at army headquarters is centered upon preparations for the arrival of National Guardsmen and the whipping into shape of those army units which will take the place of the troops now stationed all along the Rio Grande.

Twelve thousand guardsmen are expected to start for somewhere in Texas before morning. Nine thousand and others are expected to follow immediately and within ten days General Funston is expected to have 70,000 men to supplement the regular army units at his disposal.
