Farmer in Texas Plows Up Fortune In Silver Bars

Weslona, Tex., Aug. 12.—A farmer named Palmer, near here, a few days ago plowed up silver bars on his farm variously estimated to be worth from \$100,000 to \$280,000.

Palmer says he will send the bars to the Denver mint. It is believed the silver bars were left here by Spaniards in the sixteenth or seventeenth century, when they retreated, owing to the assault of Mexicans against them.

Mulford Wins the Mountain Auto Climb

Colorado Springs, Colo., Aug. 12.—Ralph Mulford yesterday won the Pike's Peak automobile climbing contest. His time over the twelve and one-half mile course was 18 minutes 48.7 seconds, notwithstanding that he lost one minute and twenty seconds in adjusting his carburetor.

Patterson finished second in 22 minutes and 15 seconds, but was disqualified for running out of the course and second place was awarded to George Buzzance, whose time was one minute and thirty-three seconds slower.

The first race, starting at noon, was won by Fred Junk in 23 minutes 4 seconds, his teammate, Roy Stentz, finishing second in 23:29. Henry Jones was third in 26:03.

Biloway clouds enveloped the peak the greater part of the day and the crowds along the race course heard the roar of laboring motors long before the cars came into view.
