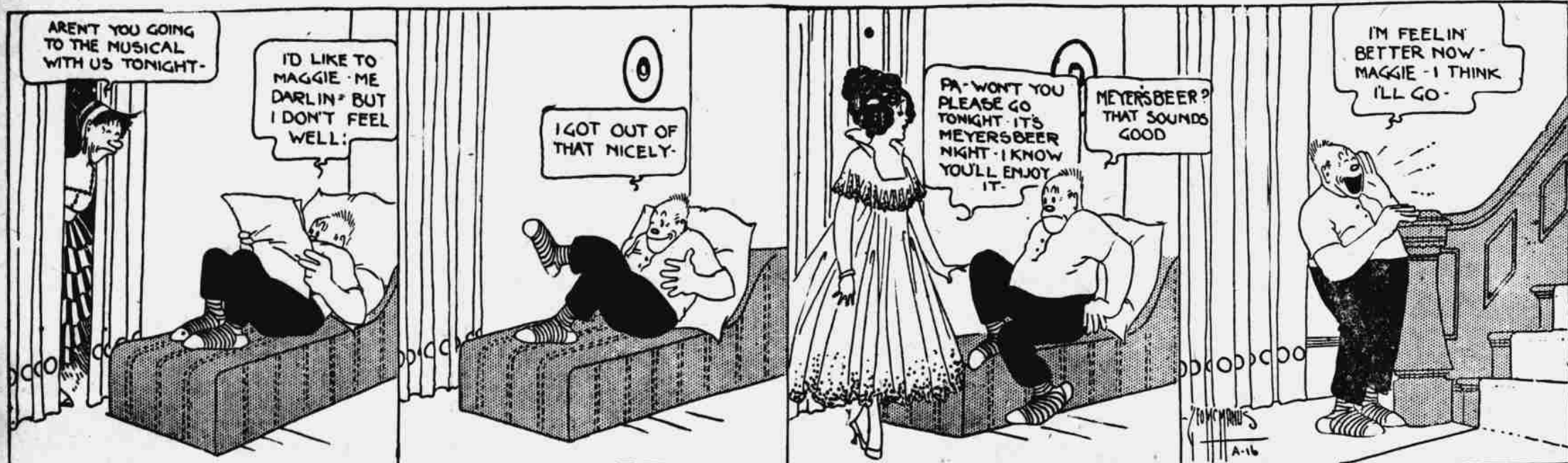

Plestina Matched With Christensen

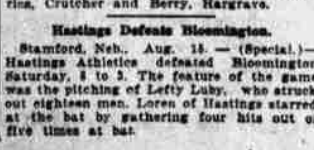
