ONE of "Pa" Rourke's cherished ONE of "Pa" Rourke's cherished ideas in connection with base ball has to do with the value of the bunt. He is strong for the sac-rifice hit, as well as for the gentle little tay which dumps the ball just in front of the plate and alfords a scramble for all hands and more than an even chance for the base runner to land safe. Also, the slugging Denver-ities are charged with having struck out 467 times in 3/6/2 turns at bat, while Omaha is given but 380 out of 3/635 times up. Total Bases 1,487 1,425 Hits. 1,065 1,030 Denver has made fourteen more Denver has made fourteen more home runs than Omaha and sixteen more three-base hits, while Omaha leads the Grizzlies by forty-eight two-base drives. This analysis might be extended indefinitely, but it has gone far enough to reasonably sup-port the contention that the burn is a great factor in the manufacture of runs, which are really the controlling factor in winning ball games.


