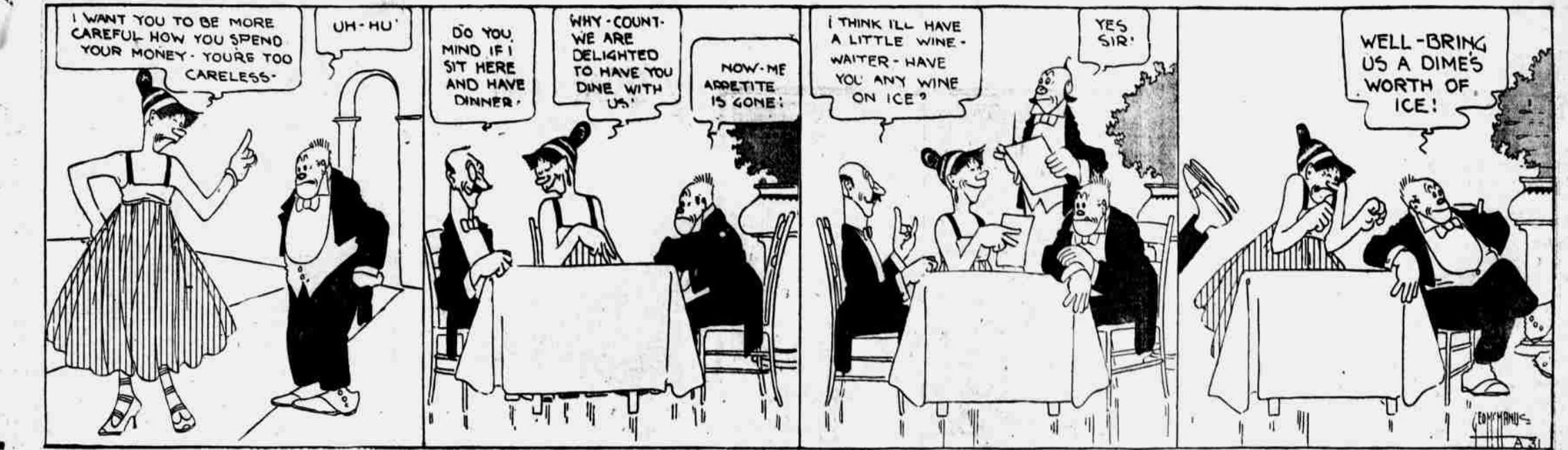

OMAHA FAILS TO BUNCH
