Eleven dead and sixteen injured was the toll of a rear-end collision on the Holdrege and Sterling branch of the Burlington at 4:15 Sunday morning, when, four miles west of Bertrand, Neb., the third section of stock train No. 156 ran into the rear end of the second section. The killed and injured were all Nebraska stockmen and farmers who, for the most part, were bringing their live stock to the Omaha market

It was the first wreck the Burlington ever had on its lines west of the Missouri river where the loss of life reached large proportions, according to George W. Loomis, assistant to General Manager Holdrege. The last wreck of any consequence on the western Burlington lines was the ditching of a Colorado passenger train near Indianola, but there were no fatalities. Dies from Injuries.

First reports of the catastrophe gave the number of killed as ten and the injured fifteeen. This morning William Votaw of Maywod died from William Votaw of Maywod died from internal injuries, increasing the list of fatalities to eleven. G. S. Kronley of Maywood and Emil Kelmar of Venango were reported killed in the first reports, but the reports received at the local headquarters of the railroad do not contain these names, but contain the additional names of B. Crowley of Maywood and W. Vantow of Venango. J. E. O'Brien of Wallace was also reported killed, but the victim later proved to be John Slager of Wallace, who is employed by O'Brien.
