Excellent Cash Demand and Heavy Exports Boom, the Wheat Market Again.

CORN SETS A NEW RECORD

Omaha, Oct. 29, 1916. The strong export situation and an excellent cash demand gave the cash wheat market another boost today. Wheat was especially strong, the hard winter selling from 2 1/2c higher and the durum selling about 1/2c above the average price of yesterday.
