Cattle—Receipts were quite liberal for a Friday, eighty-one fresh cars being reported in the demand was good and the market in very satisfactory condition for this late in the week. Prices paid were generally steady with yesterday, which means 10c to 15c higher than a week ago. The big end of the receipts changed hands in good session in the morning.

Hogs—For a Friday the hog run was just decent, or 16,000 head. Free shipper buying again today, resulting in a higher price for the highest levels touched since September or the best ever seen during the month of January.

Sheep—Fat lambs were a little more active than they have been the last couple of days. Sellers made another attempt to boost prices, but buyers were not so ready to follow the shipper lead as they did yesterday and while they bought most of their hogs at prices that averaged 10c to 15c higher than a week ago, the sheep market was noticeably slow, the less desirable kinds being much harder to move than on Thursday.

The finish was drab, a sprinkling of light and plain mixed hogs that were left from earlier receipts giving sellers a good deal of grief while some good hogs that came in on the extreme close were slow at the morning auction. General market was however around the highest, with a price of \$10.50 catching most of the sales, with tops as high as \$11.45. As noted above, these prices are the highest ever paid in January.

Woolled lambs have not entirely recovered from the slump they went through last week and are still largely 10c to 15c below a week ago. The bulk of the good western lambs is moving at \$11.00 to \$11.25, with a steady top of \$11.50 on high growing Mexicana.

GRAIN AND PRODUCE

Future Market Declines and Cash Wheat Situation is Uncommonly Slow.

TRADERS HOLDING BACK

The cash wheat situation was rather slow today on account of the decline in the future market and the fact that the bulk of the receipts were reported during the early trading hours.

There was very little disposition on the part of the sellers to get on, as the market was quoted from 2 to 2 1/2c lower, and most of the traders preferred to take their chances on tomorrow's market.

The demand, however, would have easily taken care of the light receipts, and the few sales of No. 2 hard were made at \$1.17 1/2 and \$1.18 while the 3 hard brought from \$1.16 to \$1.17 1/2.

The receipts of corn were considerably better and the demand for this cereal was fairly active at prices ruling from unchanged to 1c lower.

No. 2 white corn sold at a 1/2c premium over the same grade of yellow, but the 3 white and yellow sold at the practically the same price, the bulk of the specialties going at 30c and 31 1/2c. No. 2 mixed corn sold at 29c and 30c and the 3 mixed brought from 28 1/2c to 29 1/2c.

The oats market was very active considering the light receipts and the market generally was quoted unchanged, the 3 white grade selling at 5 1/2c.

The receipts of rye and barley were unimportant and both of these markets were quoted unchanged.

Clearances were: Wheat and flour, equal to 1,550,000 bushels; corn, 52,000 bushels; oats, 25,000 bushels; wheat, unchanged; corn, 20 up.

Primary wheat receipts were 52,000 bushels and shipments 700,000 bushels, against receipts of 1,748,000 bushels and shipments of 572,000 bushels last year.

Primary corn receipts were 1,046,000 bushels and shipments 234,000 bushels, against receipts of 1,022,000 bushels and shipments of 475,000 bushels last year.

Primary oats receipts were 462,000 bushels and shipments 255,000 bushels, against receipts of 927,000 bushels and shipments of 1,125,000 bushels last year.
