THE hats herewith shown represent the newest creations in harmonious designs for late Winter wear. The trend of the modes in hats is still toward the small sizes, despite the fact that many women believe large, wide-brimmed hats increase the youthful appearance of the face.

Fur still retains its prominence in the trimming of the smart hats, imparting at one and the same time an appearance of warmth and comfort and piquancy.

The felt hat with the upturned brim in front is trimmed with peacock feathers. Its effect is undeniably chic.

With the broadcloth afternoon gown, with Persian lamb collar and cuffs, shown at the left of this page, is worn the Tartar turban of Persian lamb, with its drooping tassel.

The velvet turban of the same material as the coat has a fur band of the same fur as the collar or neck-piece as the case may be.

Fur is even used in conjunction with oak leaves and lace on the wide-brimmed hat for afternoon dress wear. Velling extends down under the brim, giving a shaded effect to the upper part of the face. The ornaments attached to the brim harmonize with the color scheme of the gown and hat.
