

### Nebraska CIVIL SERVICE IN LINCOLN SCHOOLS

Senator Oberlies of Lancaster  
Introduces Bill Carrying  
Provisions.

#### FIXING WORK IN PRISONS

(From Staff Correspondent.)  
Lincoln, Jan. 19.—(Special.)—The senate, after a short time spent this morning on bills, adjourned until 2 o'clock Monday afternoon.

Civil service to apply to teachers, principals and the superintendent in Lincoln is provided in a senate bill introduced by Senator L. C. Oberlies, of Lancaster. It is S. F. 77. Penitentiary convicts cannot be employed in any industry now established in Nebraska, according to a bill by Senator Moriarty of Douglas.

**Work in the Prison.**  
It is specified, in a proposed statement, that they can make only clothing, shoes and furniture at the penitentiary proper. The bill further provides that the minimum wage, when convicts are contracted to work for counties, cities, villages or other state institutions, shall be 75 cents a day.

Careless handling or taking of automobiles is discouraged in two bills introduced by Senator McMullen of Gage. In the first, an intoxicated person who drives an automobile, is subject to a fine of from \$100 to \$300, plus imprisonment in the county jail, the wrongful taking of another's car, without his consent, is vested with the same penalty as the man who drinks, under the second bill. At the present time the maximum for the wrongful taking of a car is \$100 or three months in the county jail.

**Judges and Relatives.**  
Judges of courts of record and justices of the peace must not sit in cases in which their relatives back to the fourth degree are connected, or in which they have been attorneys in the past for some of the interested parties or even in which their law partners have been attorneys, under the provisions of a bill introduced as an amendment by Senator Moriarty of Douglas.

The anti-rabbit coursing Humane society bill, already in the house, was introduced in the senate by Sawyer of Lancaster Friday.

#### Anti-Coursing Bill.

It is designed to prevent the coursing of rabbits with dogs, the roping of steers and horses at wild west shows, the picking of chickens before they are dead—as is now practiced by poultrymen—and makes two hours the limit of time for letting a horse stand tied in the open street during a storm or blizzard.

#### Alliance Creamery Makes 500,000 Pounds of Butter

Alliance, Neb., Jan. 19.—(Special.)—The Alliance Creamery, which is the largest concern of its kind in western Nebraska, has just made an annual report which shows that the company last year paid over \$100,000 to the farmers in this section for cream. It manufactured 500,000 pounds of butter, 100 car loads of ice and 15,000 gallons of ice cream. The company declared a dividend of 5 per cent.

#### Notes From Seward.

Seward, Neb., Jan. 19.—(Special.)—August Gade narrowly escaped death Thursday when his big car dashed off Plum Creek bridge and onto the ice, twelve feet below. The car was smashed considerably and he received bruises.

#### Hundred-Thousand-Dollar Hotel for City of Fairbury

Fairbury, Neb., Jan. 19.—(Special Telegram.)—Announcement was made in this city late today that a syndicate of Fairbury capitalists comprising Messrs. J. W. McDonnell, Pat and J. B. Walsh and Jacob Conrad, would erect a modern hotel here this spring to cost approximately \$100,000. The proposed structure will cost double that of the Mary Etta hotel that was erected in 1908.

The new hotel will be erected at least within a block of the public square and will be in operation before the end of the summer.

A modern \$50,000 structure will be erected by the Henry Ford Motor company.
