Barn Thief Leaves Corn Trail Four Blocks From Keegan Residence.

IMPROVERS MEET TONIGHT

A leaky sack of corn nearly resulted in the detection of a thief who broke into the barn of John Keegan, Thirty-fourth and Q streets, Saturday evening and stole seven thoroughbred chickens and a 100-pound sack of corn.

The theft occurred some time in the night. At the Thirty-third street intersection it was plain that the thief had discovered the leak and repaired it.

German Claims Denied By Belgian Minister Here. Washington, Jan. 29.—Minister Haventh of Belgium issued a statement tonight denouncing as untrue the German government's contention that deportation of Belgians for forced labor is a social necessity an account of unemployment resulting from the British blockade.

"In reality what has happened is the exact contrary to the statement of Germany," said the minister, "and as in the case of the deportation, it is the Germans who have created a state of affairs upon which they have afterwards endeavored to establish the justification of the illegal measures taken by them."

CAMPAIGN FOR PENSIONS

This club, at a meeting held in the Lindell hotel at Lincoln, adopted these rules in connection with its campaign to see enactment of a state pension law for teachers.

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ITALIAN-AMERICAN CLUB CELEBRATES

Big Crowd Gathers at Henshaw for Banquet and General Good Time.

MAYOR DAHLMAN SPEAKER

One hundred members of the newly organized Omaha Italian-American Political club gathered around the festive board Sunday evening in the rathskeller of the Henshaw. Following a substantial menu, the attendants were treated to a program of oratorical interest.

Carl Marfisi served as toastmaster. Joseph Sesto, president of the club, was the orator of the evening. He spoke in the Italian language and invested his words with considerable dramatic ability.

He urged his fellow countrymen to be loyal to the principles of the club and to make themselves honorable American citizens. He was enthusiastically applauded for his lofty sentiments.

Mayor Dahلمان Talks. "Continue to be good citizens and cherish high ideals as you have done in the past. You are to be commended and encouraged upon having such a splendid organization," said Mayor Dahلمان. He reviewed the history of Italian-Americans in Omaha, declaring that many have become home owners and desirable citizens.

He praised their loyalty and adjured them to foster their schools and churches and take an interest in clean politics.

Edward Maggi of Lincoln, quoted state records to show that Italian citizens of Nebraska have an enviable record. He said it is incumbent upon every citizen—whether he be from Italy or some other country—to perpetuate the principles for which the forefathers of this country fought and died.

Mr. Maggi announced that he expects to make Omaha his residence in the not far distant future.

Mr. Marfisi emphasized the importance of raising the younger generation of Italians on a high educational and physical plane, that they may be well equipped to take up the duties of citizenship and be an honor to their country and their forebears.

L. J. Piatti stated it is well that the new organization was launched upon a non-partisan basis, because he believed that partisan lines are disappearing in local politics.

Other speakers were: John Lynch, Frank C. Best, Henry McDonald, Joseph M. Calabria, Sebastian Salerno and Tony Costanzo.

VILLA FOLLOWERS FIRE UPON TRAIN

Bandits Reported Making Attack on Murguia's Men 110 Miles South of Juarez.

REFUGEES REACH BORDER

Juarez, Mexico, Jan. 29.—Villa followers fired into General Jose Carlos Murguia's military train at Santa Sofia, 110 miles south of Juarez, last night and the military train was forced to return to Guzman before resuming the trip to Casas Grandes, according to semi-official sources here.

The Mexico Northwestern passenger train which left Casas Grandes for Juarez late yesterday was also pursued by Villa cavalry, but the engineer opened the throttle and escaped from the Villa followers, according to the same source. This train was crowded with foreign and Mexican refugees.

Great fires were illuminating Colonia Dublan, General Pershing's headquarters, as they passed there last evening, the passengers said. All woodwork used in the encampment and surplus fodder were burning.

Although the passengers heard of rebels firing on General Murguia's train, few knew of the report that their own had been threatened. They all said, however, they had heard rumors of Villa bands occupying El Valle. Despite this, many Americans were reported to be remaining in Mexico. There were sixteen cars in the train from Casas Grandes, but the number of Americans were not over 100. The rest were Mexicans. The distance up was only 158 miles, yet the
