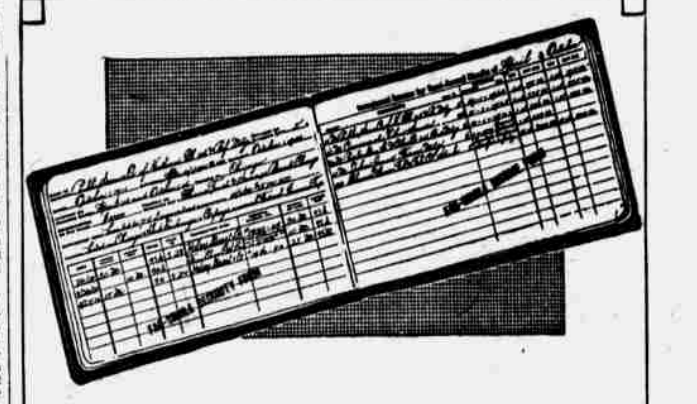

Living Expenses Up; Telephone Rates Down. While the cost of most of the necessities of life has been going up, the price of telephone service has stood still, generally, or has been lowered. In a few cases only has it been increased.

Although the buyer of meat, sugar, flour, potatoes, or butter still receives but sixteen ounces in a pound, although paying more money than before, the telephone user has been steadily getting more and better service and paying the same or less money than in the past.

The people of this country pay a great deal more today for food, fuel and clothing than they did a few years ago. In the telephone business we are paying, on an average, double the price for materials and supplies, we did three years ago.

Efficiency of the Service Increased. Constantly the efficiency and value of telephone service to the subscriber has been increased. Today you can talk to an average of nearly twice as many persons in each exchange as you could five years ago.
