

**FORD HOSPITAL IS OMAHA BUILT**

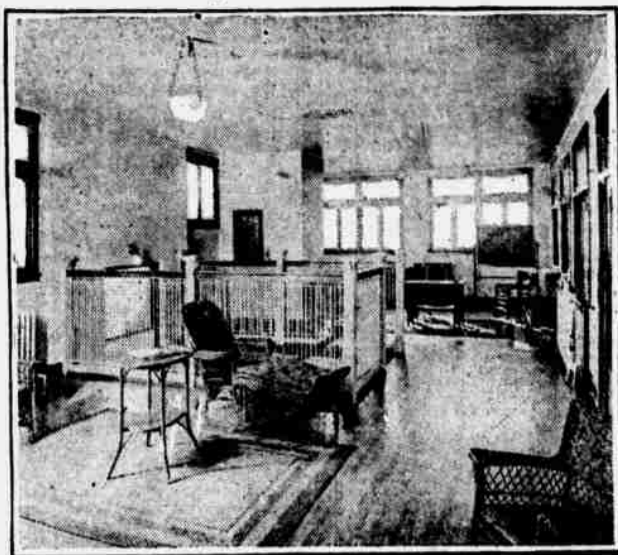
Local Business Men Get Preference Wherever Possible—Result is Fine Structure.

**HAS MANY NEW FEATURES**

Believing that the best possible way of boosting itself is by boosting Omaha, directors of the Home Builders made it a point to patronize home industry and business as much as possible in the construction of the new Ford hospital. Busk & Wind, who were awarded the general contract, completed the structure in record time. The furniture, nearly all of it built to special order, was furnished by the Burgess-Nash company. The complicated electrical system was installed by the Bennett Electrical company, which also furnished the fixtures. Two electrical self-starting elevators, with all the safety appliances, were installed by the Otis Elevator company. The Johnson Hardware company was awarded the contract for the finished hardware. Morris Bros. put in the plumbing, which is claimed to be the most modern and up to date of its kind installed. Cornice work and the ventilation contract was awarded to C. F. Epeneter. Cooking supplies and trays were purchased from Milton Rogers & Sons and the Hotel Equipment company. Sherman & McConnell company furnished the drugs, while the disinfectants came from the W. G. Cleveland company. From Lew Wentworth, Inc., was purchased the weather strips, from Frenzer Silverware company the silverware and from the Sterill Waterproof Fabrics company the waterproof fabrics. From J. J. Deright was purchased a safe.

A private telephone exchange was installed by the Nebraska Telephone company. The Omaha Crockery company supplied the dishes, the Carter Sheet Metal company door frames and metal work and the Weir Planning company the mill work. The vitrified brick contract was awarded to Sunderland Bros. and the terrazzo floors were put in by the Nebraska Terrazzo and Mosaic Tile company. Ornamental iron, reinforced steel and dies were furnished by the Omaha Structural Steel company. Concrete Engineering company and the Omaha Foundry company. **Flesh and Bones Are No Barrier to Mechanical Eyes**

The Roentgen department of the Ford hospital, with its X-ray apparatus installed at a cost of \$5,500, is the equal of the most modern and up to date in this section of the country. With the machine it is as easy to see through a person as it is to see an object through a window pane.

The department occupies six specially constructed rooms in the basement. Because of the danger to the operator, the operating room is lined with lead as a precaution to keep the rays from coming through. It has been found that the rays affect persons who continually work around X-ray machines.

A very high current is necessary to operate the complicated apparatus. In the transforming room the electric current is raised from 220 volts to 85,000.

In the radiographic room pictures are taken, which are then developed in a special dark room. Perhaps the most important place of the department is the cystoscopic room. Here a silver solution, usually silver iodide, is injected into the kidneys before X-ray pictures of the elimination organs are taken. The leuroscopic room completes the department.

In the room where Sitz baths are taken a special marble control table is used, from which the operator directs his work. Two massive white marble benches are also in this room, serving the purpose of shampoo tables. In another room is the Turkish bath, and so on down to the Nuheim baths. The entire section of the building that houses the baths is of tile with

white marble walls separating the rooms. The bath tubs used are of porcelain, cast in solid pieces. A recuperating, or, rather, rest room with attendants is at the disposal of patients following their baths

and treatments. The rest room is also of white tile.
