

GRAIN AND PRODUCE
Wheat and Oats Prices Advance, but Corn Market is Irregular. DEMAND IS VERY GOOD

Omaha, February 15, 1917. The cash grain situation continued active today, and while the receipts were not as heavy as yesterday, the supply was sufficient to take care of the demand, which was very good.

The wheat and oats markets scored good advances, but the corn market was rather irregular, the price on this cereal being quoted from 1/2c higher to 3/4c higher, and wheat raised from 1/2c to 3/4c higher, and oats were quoted from unchanged to 1/2c higher.

The cash sales of wheat showed No. 2 hard selling at \$1.74 1/2 to \$1.75, No. 3 hard was quoted from \$1.73 1/2 to \$1.74, with the bulk selling at \$1.73 1/2, and the lower grades of hard winter ranged from \$1.58 to \$1.64 on sample hard to \$1.64 on No. 4 hard.

Corn sold very readily at the prevailing market prices, No. 2 white selling at \$1.00, a premium of 1/2c to 1c over the yellow, while No. 2 mixed ranged from \$1.00 to \$1.01, and the No. 4 grades of all corn sold from \$1.00 to \$1.01.

There was a good trade in oats and an excellent demand for all the different grades of this cereal. Standard oats were quoted at \$1.00, No. 2 white sold from \$1.00 to \$1.01, No. 4 white brought from \$1.00 to \$1.01, and No. 2 mixed sold from \$1.00 to \$1.01, and the lower grades of hard winter ranged from \$1.00 to \$1.01.

Clearances were: Wheat and flour, equal to 174,000 bushels; corn, 53,000 bushels; oats, 24,000 bushels. Primary wheat receipts were 42,000 bushels and shipments 62,000 bushels, against receipts of 1,457,000 bushels and shipments of 1,478,000 bushels last year.

Primary corn receipts were 1,968,000 bushels and shipments 1,446,000 bushels, against receipts of 1,322,000 bushels and shipments of 1,880,000 bushels last year. Primary oat receipts were 344,000 bushels and shipments 387,000 bushels, against receipts of 318,000 bushels and shipments of 344,000 bushels last year.
