Fifteen Victims of German Submarine.

London, March 20 .- Fifteen men from the American steamer Vigilancia sunk by a German submarine, are now

Americans Lost.

Plymouth, March 19,-Amercian: drowned were: Third Officer Neils I' North and Third Engineer Carl Adeholde. This information was given out by Captain Frank A. Middeton of New York, who with the survivors of the Vigilancia, has reached the main land and probably will make affidavits tomorrow before the

American consul.

To the Associated Press. Captain Middleton said today that his vessel Middleton said today that his vessel was sunk without warning. Two life loats were lowered from the Vigilancia and the crew of twenty-eight men got into them. Owing to the swell of the ocean, however, twenty-five men were thrown into the water. The boats of the captain and the mates picked up ten of the men, but the other fifteen were drowned.

Captain Middelton says he saw no submarine during the attack, but that one of the engineers thinks he saw a

one of the engineers thinks he saw a periscope. The captain saw two oily streaks on the water about a thousand yards from the steamer, which he took yards from the steamer, which is took to be tracks of torpedoes. The Vigilancia was flying the American flag and its name and a flag were painted on either side. Speaking of his experience in the boat, Captain Middleton said:

"After rescuing as many of the crew to possible in the boats, we had his

"After rescuing as many of the crew as possible in the boats, we had biscuits and water. At night I fired distress signals several times. By the glare of the lights, I saw a subnarine following fifty yards from the boats between 10 o'clock Friday night and 2:30 o'clock Saturday morning, but it made no attempt to help us. We suffered great hardship in the boats. One man of the engine room staff is paralyzed as a result of exposure. exposure.

Third officer North of the Vilig-lancia was born in Denmark, but was a naturalized American. The name of Engineer Adeholde was not con-tained in the list of the crew given out in New York Saturday night. This list said there were forty-five men in the ship's company of whom twenty-one, including Captain Middleton, were Americans. Two of the Americans were naturalized citizens and one a Canadian, had taken out his first citizenship papers.
