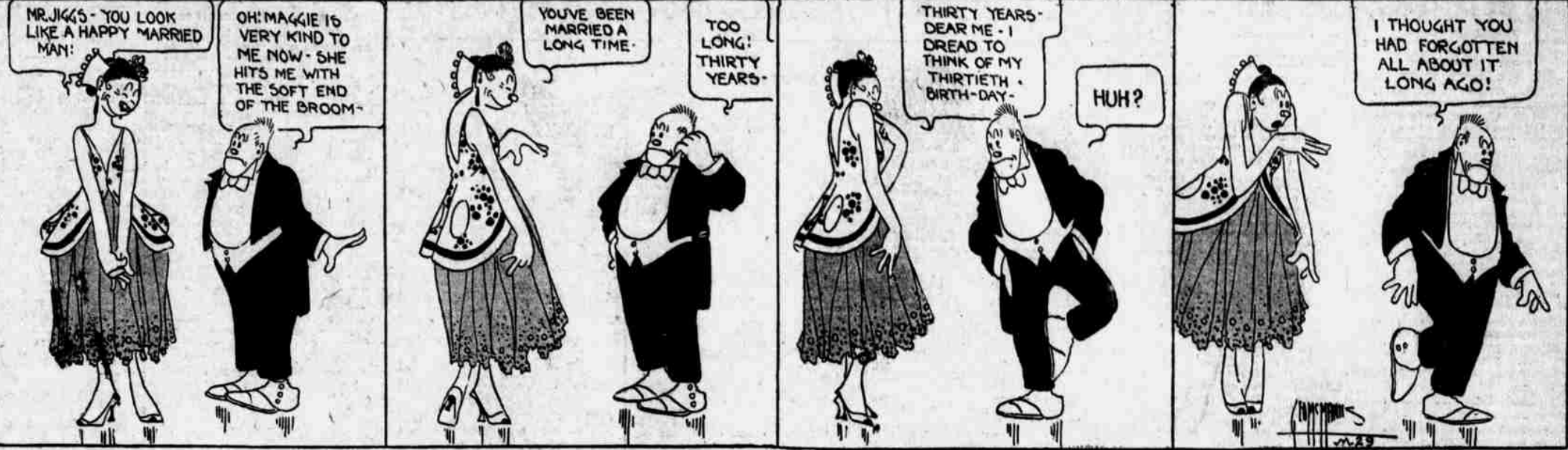

servant. Some of the senators would find out, he said, when they faced their constituency at the next election, after thwarting the will of the people in this legislature.

Chairman Tanner of the committee of the whole joined with Senator Sawyer in the rebuke. He referred to "ten-gallon boys" and "on with vaudeville shows," but the "show" went right on for an hour afterward.

Sandall Looks Ahead. Senator Sandall accused the wets of arguing against prohibition by saying that it would not prohibit. Then when the wets were about to make it drastic enough to prohibit effectively, they step in and refuse to sanction it.
