Cash Wheat Very Dull—Buyers Hesitate to Take Even Light Offerings.

BRISK DEMAND FOR CORN

The cash wheat situation was very dull today and while the offerings were light only a small part of the receipts were disposed of.

The cash market, however, was rather weak and only a few of the sellers cared to dispose of their offerings at a decline.

The corn market was very active at a comparatively good advance and there was an excellent inquiry for all grades.

Clearances were, wheat and flour, equal to 480,000 bushels; corn, 400,000 bushels.

Chicago Grain and Provisions. All Grain and Meat Products Advance Because of War Situation.

Chicago, April 4.—Impending war in Germany gave irrefragable force to buying movements on the Board of Trade today.

Through reactions, due in part to setbacks in the New York stock market, temporarily carried what backward after the initial break.

Provisions, like grain, felt the stimulus of war demand. Diminishing warehouse stocks and fresh advances in the hog market were additional strengthening factors.
