GRAIN AND PRODUCE

Cash Wheat Follows Futures for Gain of Six to Fourteen Cents.

DEMAND UP TO OFFERINGS

Omaha, May 9, 1917. The cash market followed the strong advance in futures today and ruled from 6 to 14c higher, establishing new record for high-priced wheat.

The demand was excellent on the advance and the receipts were extremely light. The traders had no difficulty in disposing of their wheat.

REMARKS

The demand for corn showed a big improvement today and a large part of the offerings were disposed of at an early hour at prices ranging from 12 to 14c higher.

NEW YORK STOCKS

Far-Reaching Program of War Taxation Causes Some Anxiety.

RAILWAY ISSUES DECLINE

New York, May 9.—The financial community expressed its anxiety at the government's far-reaching program of war taxation today by heavy liquidation of securities.

Supporting orders in rail and short covering profits resulted in many market recoveries. United States Steel, for example, recovering almost all of its 2 1/2 point loss.

REMARKS

Recessions of 1 to 3 points marked the closing of the day. Total sales were unchanged on bonds.

CHICAGO GRAIN AND PROVISIONS

Market Advances at Opening and Later

REMARKS

Chicago, May 9.—The top of yesterday's record breaking 14 cent gain, the market at the opening today advanced 14 cents more and later secured a 2 1/2 cent rise.

The impetus came from the government crop report showing the largest abandonment of wheat acreage ever known in the United States.

NEW YORK STOCKS AND BONDS

Losses at Opening Run from One to Two Points

REMARKS

New York, May 9.—Stocks were two points lower at the opening of today's market, with a general liquidation by the publication of the government's sweeping revenue measure, causing further liquidation by apprehensive holders.

Losses ran from 1 to 2 points in United States Steel, Bethlehem Steel, Marine preferred and popular markets, equipments, motors and utilities. Rails again yielded easily, leading breaking over a point.
