Grafting Saving Trees Destroyed by Germans

Paris, April 30.—France is not unduly depressed by the destruction of its orchards, because a remedy is said to have been found for the evil inflicted on their agricultural districts by the Germans.

As soon as the wholesale felling of the fruit trees was announced by the French press an astute Norman peasant wrote to his paper pointing out that nothing was easier than to save a broken or hacked fruit tree at this time of the year by careful grafting. The Horticultural Society of France took up the idea at once and issued detailed instructions for the grafting of every kind and variety of fruit trees. His work must be completed by May 15. Thus French ingenuity bids fair to overcome the problem raised by the damage done to the fruit trees.
