Wheat Receipts Light and Demand is Not Very Active on the Omaha Market.

The cash demand for wheat was moderately active, but the trade was extremely light on account of very light receipts...

There was very little off-grade wheat reported sold, the demand being mainly for the No. 2 and hard winter varieties...

The trade in corn was extremely quiet and while there was some demand for this cereal the buyers were bidding very low...

There was a few sales of corn reported during the later part of the session and the sales showed about a 20c decline...

The premium on white corn, which disappeared today, the better grades of white selling from \$1.45 to \$1.51, while the yellow brought \$1.35 to \$1.40...

The trade in oats was slow during the early part of the session, but the buyers were active during the last half hour of trading...

Clearances were: Wheat and hard equal 1,375,000 bushels; corn, 17,000 bushels; oats, 52,000 bushels...

Primary wheat receipts were 745,000 bu. and shipments, 1,005,000 bu., against receipts, 831,000 bu. and shipments of 665,000 bu. last year...

Primary corn receipts were 491,000 bu. and shipments, 479,000 bu., against receipts of 590,000 bu. and shipments of 492,000 bu. last year...

Primary oat receipts were 291,000 bu. and shipments of 712,000 bu., against receipts of 1,215,000 bu. and shipments of 1,311,000 bu. last year...

Cattle—Good heavy beefs have not shown so much change, being not to exceed 10c to 15c lower...

Light and medium weight steers are around 25c lower, and light yearlings all the way from 10c lower, depending upon kind and quality.

Cows and heifers have suffered more on an average, but beef steers, being around 20c lower for the week...

Light stockers and feeders of good quality are about steady, but fresh feeders and stockers on the rough orders are weak to unevenly lower.

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NEW YORK STOCKS

Porto Rico Sugar Makes Startling Advance in Wake of U. S. Steel, Which Continues to Soar.

New York, May 26.—(United States Steel) achieved the new high record of 124 1/2 in the course of the brief but active trading...

With one exception virtually all the developments of the day were of constructive character, but there was a sharp decline in the latter part of the session...

Producers again had advanced quotations for the refined metal on orders deliverable during the first quarter of the year...

Industrial Alcohol forged steadily ahead at an advance of 3/4 points to 124, and extraordinary activity was shown by corn products at an extreme gain of 2 points...

Total sales of about 77,000 shares were in keeping with the activity of recent days, which was a usual furnished full one-quarter of the whole.

Important changes in the bank statements denoted the shifting of money incident to the flotation of the \$2,000,000,000 loan. Actual reserves of local institutions in their own vaults decreased by more than \$22,000,000, while reserves in the Federal bank increased over \$60,000,000...

The loan expansion of more than \$38,000,000 was transmissible in the latter deal. Backwardness of prices in the latter deal, however, was accounted for by the strength of General Motors and Studebaker at gains of 3/4 and 4 points, respectively.

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
