Philadelphia, June 11.—Testifying today in the \$900,000 suit of the Baltimore Federal league club against Organized Base Ball growing out of the peace agreement of directors in 1915, whereby the Federal league went out of existence, L. Edwin Goldman, a director of the Baltimore club, said his club knew absolutely nothing about negotiations to put the league out of business until the peace agreement had been reached.
