Witness in Keet Case Is Killed by Freight Train Springfield, Mo., June 21.—Josh B. DEATH PROBE MAY UNCOVER CADET RING

Woman Attorney Interested in Cruger Case Says 700 Young Women Missing in New York Since January 1. New York, June 21.—Sensational allegations of a widespread traffic in girls in this city resulted in police Commissioner Wood's ordering a rigid investigation of the charges today. His action followed the announcement that between 700 and 800 girls have disappeared from their homes here since January 1. This was the most important result thus far of the belated discovery by a woman lawyer and a private detective of the murder of Ruth Cruger, 18 years old high school student, months after the police had ended a superficial search for her.

Faurot on the Job. "Spare no one" was the order given by Commissioner Woods to Inspector J. A. Faurot, who was placed in charge of the inquiry, which is expected to shake the police department from top to bottom.

Faurot was directed to sit thoroughly the avowal of Mrs. Grace Humiston, the lawyer in the Cruger case, that white slave traders are responsible for the heavy toll of missing girls and to place responsibility on those in the police department whose duty it was to find Miss Cruger's body.

Mrs. Humiston today emphasized the importance of having Alfredo Cocchi, who is formally charged with Miss Cruger's murder, brought back from Italy, where he fled after Miss Cruger disappeared. She declared that if the authorities can get a statement from him "he will involve so many important people that the

case will be one of the most sensational ever exposed in this country." Search for possible victims who may have shared a fate similar to that of Miss Cruger was begun by the police today in every shop or cellar occupied by Cocchi since he came to this country.

Quiz Fugitive's Wife. For two hours today Mrs. Marie Cocchi, wife of the fugitive, was questioned at the district attorney's office. She insisted she knew nothing that could throw light on Miss Cruger's disappearance or murder. She was not in his shop on February 13, the day the young woman disappeared, she said, and because of coolness between her husband and herself, she did not visit his shop from September 8, 1916, until two days after Miss Cruger was reported missing and after her husband had fled.

Expect Peaceful Settlement of Chinese Internal Trouble Washington, June 21.—Peaceful settlement of China's internal troubles was forecast in an official dispatch to the Chinese embassy from Peking.

The message dated today said the two southern provinces of Yunnan and Kwantung, which formed the backbone of the southern secessionist movement, had notified the central government that they favor co-operation toward a peaceful settlement and are ready to do everything possible to clear up the situation. Several other provinces are said to be about to take similar action.

PRO-GERMAN GREEKS MUST QUIT COUNTRY

Thirty-One Former Officers Who Opposed Allies Must Follow Constantine Into Exile. Athens, June 21.—A list of persons to be expelled from Greece following the abdication of King Constantine has been forwarded to the Greek minister of the interior. It includes the names of Demetrios Gounaris, former premier; Prof. Georgios Streit, former foreign minister; General Dousmanis, chief of the Greek general staff; Colonel Metaxas, chief assistant to the general staff; M. Mercouris, M. Esclin, M. Savies, chief of the reservists, and M. Liviesatos, who figured prominently in the disturbances at Athens last December, when French troops were attacked by Greek reservists.

Junk Man Is Murdered By Three Chicago Boys Chicago, Ill., June 21.—David Stryer, 33 years old, a junk man, was beaten to death with a base ball bat by three boys between 12 and 14 years of age in an alley on the west side this afternoon. Robbery is believed to have been the motive.

American Miners Reported Killed by Indian Guides Washington, June 21.—Two American miners were reported to the State department today as having been killed last October by treacherous Indian guides while prospecting for gold on the Caroni river in eastern Venezuela.
