ROURKES DIVIDE BARGAIN MATINEE

Sioux City Wins First Game by Pounding Marty O'Toole, But Currie Is Too Much in Second.

Omaha and Sioux City split even in a double bill at Rourke park yesterday afternoon before 4,000 Sabbath customers.

Sioux City captured the first fray of the bargain event 6 to 2, but Earl Smith, with the generous assistance of Mr. Connolly, who plays third base for the Sioux, evened up honors by taking the second event in the ninth inning 3 to 2.

Marty O'Toole went down to defeat before Bill Rose in the opener. Bill was too much for Marty. He only allowed the Rourke five hits while O'Toole was bunched rather soundly.

The Sioux counted two in the first stanza, when Gilmore doubled to right and Rader pounded a triple to center. Sing Thompson's fielding of the ball at first base was messy and Rader came home.
