E. J. Hart, 6045 Evans street, one of the first six Omahans drawn, expressed pleasure that his name should be near the top of the list. "Now I know just where I stand and can lay my plans accordingly," he said.

Hart was married August 23, 1915. When his wife heard the news she began to sob. "I don't believe it," she cried.

Hart was born and raised in Omaha. He is 24 years old and a graduate of Creighton college. He has a son 19 months old.

Malcolm Baldrige, son of Howard M. Baldrige, former candidate for United States senator from Nebraska, was among those drawn in the human lottery. Baldrige now is at the officers' reserve training camp at Fort Snelling. He is a graduate of Yale and was a member of the Yale football team.

Lloyd A. Magney, prominent Omaha attorney and son of County Attorney Magney, was among the first to be drawn.

Ralph A. Doud, former member of The Bee staff and now at Fort Snelling attending the officers' reserve training camp, was named in the conscription list.

"I knew I'd be one of the first persons drawn," Paul Selby, former captain of the University of Omaha football team, said when advised of his selection over long distance telephone at Odesholt, Ia., where he is visiting friends.

The name of Kent Witnison, son of City Commissioner Witnison, 5554 Florence boulevard, was among the first on the list.
