A concerted effort is being made all over the United States to make the utmost possible use of these plants for the conservation of foods.

The preparedness committee of the American Society of Refrigerating Engineers is taking the matter up with the chambers of commerce all over the United States. The Commercial club of Omaha has received a communication from this society asking its co-operation. It is urged that the greatest possible quantity of high food value products be stored for winter consumption. It is urged that this valuable storage space be not given over so much to articles of food which have a low food value, but that it be reserved particularly for those of high food value.
