They were propositions drawn up by Luther, who at the time was an Augustinian monk and a lecturer on theology at the great university. They were intended for discussion between the doctors of the school, Luther never meant that they should be a public document. This is seen from the fact that they were written in Latin. It was the custom of the times to display such documents and subjects for debate for the student body and the teachers.
