Flavorings for Sweet Foods.

It is well to remember that most of our flavors are due to volatile oils, which evaporate if they get the slightest chance. Hence in using flavorings they should be added at the last possible moment to save every bit of strength.

Chocolate with Spices—Delicious as chocolate is by itself, it may be made even better by the addition of spices, especially cinnamon.

Chocolate with Coffee—Coffee may frequently be used as the liquid in preparation of chocolate dishes, though milk or water is called for.

Chocolate with Vanilla—Many people feel that the chocolate flavor is lacking without a suggestion of vanilla.

Lemon and Orange—There are at least three different flavors to be obtained from lemon or orange.
