OMAHA WILL BE SCENE OF GREAT ARMY GRID GAME

Funston and Dodge Elevens, Two Best Cantonment Teams in Country to Play Here Saturday on Creighton Field.

Omaha Saturday will be the battleground of one of the biggest foot ball games to be played in the United States this year. Elevens representing Camp Dodge and Camp Funston, the two largest army cantonments in the country, will clash on Creighton field that afternoon.

This game will mark Omaha's first opportunity in a decade to witness a game played by well known college stars. Not since Nebraska and Minnesota clashed at Rourke park ten years ago has Omaha been the scene of a real big game. Omaha foot ball fans who have a taste for big league stuff have had to journey to Lincoln, and then they didn't always see it.

Saturday, however, they have their chance. Harvard, Yale, Minnesota, Illinois, Michigan, Brown, Notre Dame, Tufts, West Point, Washington, Carleton, Missouri, Texas, Colorado, Kansas, St. Louis, Dartmouth, Wisconsin, Ames, Iowa, Pennsylvania and Haskell are some of the schools represented. Players of All-American fame will take part. They are such men as Dennis of Brown, Baldrige of Yale, Withington of Harvard, Derr of Pennsylvania, Meek and Hammils of Michigan, Clark of Illinois, McCormick, Heartel and Mayer of Minnesota, Beck and Swanson of Nebraska, Lindsey, Fast and Hammond of Kansas, Rauch and Malone of Notre Dame, Robertson of Dartmouth, Withington of Harvard, Kistler of Yale, and many others.

All Proceeds to Soldiers.

This game is strictly a patriotic affair. All of the proceeds go to the soldiers. The money is divided equally between the two camps for the gymnasium funds. Both of these cantonments are in dire need of a gymnasium. They are now raising funds for this purpose and it is Omaha's hope to give each camp \$10,000.

Walter Eckersall of Chicago will referee. Gus Graham of Michigan will be field judge. Edson Shaw, captain of the Cornhuskers, will be umpire, and Tim Corey, captain of the 1916 Nebraska eleven, will be head linesman.

All have donated their services for the patriotic cause.

Preliminary Game.
As a preliminary game elevens from Fort Omaha and Fort Crook will battle for the foot ball supremacy of the army in Omaha.

A number of cantonment games have been played and will be played this fall. But Omaha, all foot ball experts agree, is to see the game of games, as the Funston and Dodge elevens easily are the class of all the army teams in the country.

Recently Camps Sherman and Sheridan played at Cincinnati. This game drew more than \$60,000. Either Dodge or Funston could lick Sherman and Sheridan put together. It is up to Omaha to make good.

The local committee hopes for a crowd of 9,000 and a box office report of \$20,000, but if Cincinnati can draw \$60,000 Omaha should pack Creighton field to the guards Saturday and the old cash register should mark up a figure well over \$20,000.
