GRAND JURY HITS AT BIG DANCE HALL

Saunders County Men Ask Authorities to Close Resort at Scott's Lake Near Morse Bluff.

Fremont, Neb., Dec. 10.—(Special Telegram.)—The grand jury of Saunders county, sitting at Wahoo, has recommended to Judge Good that the resort at Scott's lake near Morse Bluff be closed until a manager can be found who will guarantee to conduct the place along legitimate lines and prohibit all dances on Sunday. The jury in its report said it had found that young girls 15 and 16 years of age had visited the place periodically to attend the dances and that they had frequently become intoxicated on liquor furnished by someone, undesirable women frequented the place and lewdness prevailed, the report set forth.

The dance hall at Scott's Lake became one of the most popular places in this section of the country during the summer months and scores of Fremont young people visited the place each week-end.

Rev. W. H. Fross, for 11 years rector of St. James Episcopal church in Fremont, has accepted the call of St. Andrews church of Milwaukee and is planning to leave Fremont.

Former Fremont Man Dead.

Word was received in Fremont of the sudden death at Washington, of H. B. Treat, a former well known traveling salesman. Mr. Treat left Fremont 11 years ago to make his home in Omaha. A year ago failing health forced him to give up his business. The body will be brought to Fremont for burial. Mr. Treat was a member of the board of trustees of the Royal Highlanders and had planned to go to Lincoln in the spring to take charge of the lodge's investment department. A wife, one son and one daughter survive.

Lincoln, Neb., Dec. 10.—(Special.)—Dr. Lawrence W. Sidwell, first physician at Hastings insane asylum has been transferred to a similar position at the Lincoln asylum to take the place of Dr. Pillsbury promoted to superintendent.

Dr. Sidwell is an Omaha man and graduated from Creighton. He lived for 10 years at Glenwood, Ia., and is a son of Thomas Sidwell well known in Omaha as one of the superintendents of the Cudahy Packing company. The state institutions are running short on physicians and there are now three vacancies to be filled.

Lincoln Stops Teaching German in Grade Schools

Lincoln, Dec. 10.—(Special.)—The Lincoln board of education this morning passed a resolution discontinuing the teaching of German in all the public schools with the exception of the high school and the junior high school, where it will be offered as an elective study.

The order will go into effect Tuesday. This action is the culmination of a long fight in which many prominent citizens took part. Some members of the board were in favor of eliminating German from the first.

BARRETT APPEARS AGAINST MR. REED

Ex-Deputy Attorney General Now Lined Up in State Case on Side Against Former Superior.

Lincoln, Dec. 10.—(Special.)—Some time ago Dexter Tecumseh Barret, serving as deputy attorney general, was tried loose from the state payroll by his superior, Attorney General Willis E. Reed. What caused the axe to fall, is not exactly known, but it was intimated at the time the two did not pull well together in harness. Now Mr. Barret is back on the payroll again by virtue of being special counsel for the state in a case where members of the state board of educational lands cannot agree and in which Attorney General Reed takes an opposite view to that of Land Commissioner Shumway, who is responsible for the comeback of Mr. Barret.

The case involves the right to a lease of certain school lands in Sheridan county formerly owned by G. A. Heywood, who died a few years ago. The lease was made something more than 20 years ago and now boils up showing an assignment from Mr. Heywood to the Richards & Carns company, who later re-assigned it to Charles Harding and Delmer C. Eldridge of Omaha.

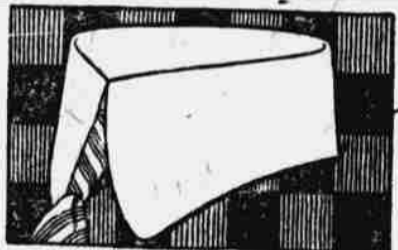
CROWDER GIVES INFORMATION ON RULES FOR DRAFT

(From a Staff Correspondent.) Lincoln, Neb., Dec. 10.—(Special.)—Messages from Provost Marshal Crowder at Washington to Governor Neville today say:

"Information is being received indicating that local and district boards and other officers are discouraging offers of voluntary service from school teachers and other citizens. Correct such condition if it exists in your state, for it is the intent and spirit of the president's call to accept and enlist all voluntary services wherever possible.

"All local and district boards are notified that supporting affidavit No. 2 in questions to be signed in support of claim for discharged based on industrial occupation may be signed by the head of the division or plant in which registrant is actually employed if the business of the firm extends into more than one state.

"Under regulations chief of engineers may present a proposition of students named by school faculty pursuing an engineering course in one of the approved technical engineering schools listed in the War department and may enlist in the enlisted reserve corps of the engineers' department and thereafter upon presentation by the registrant of his local board of a certificate of enlistment, such certificate shall be filed with the questionnaires and registrant shall be placed in class five on grounds that he is in military service of the United States."

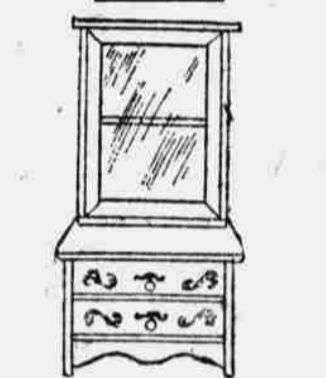
