Cattle-Cattle receipts were an usual rather light for the first day of the year, about 4,000 head and quality was much the same as Monday. The market presented no new features, desirable weighty stock being slow to move while the fat and lighter grades moved freely at steady to strong prices. There was a vigorous demand for heavy beefs at generally stronger prices, and the two-day advance on butcher stock has been about 100 to 125 cents. Business in stockers and feeders was rather quiet, but the market was strong and anything useful sold readily and well at full recent quotations.
