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NEW YORK STOCKS

Market Very Sluggish Owing to Developments in War Zone Absorbing All Interest.

New York, March 22.—The sluggish course of today's stock market was largely if not wholly influenced by developments in the foreign war zone.

Stocks were slightly irregular at the outset but immediately rallied, only to lose more than their initial advantage before midday.

Shipping, representative industrial and miscellaneous issues shared in the gradual decline, which became most pronounced in the final hour.

War shares, which should benefit in the logical course of events by the further enormous wastage of arms and ammunition now proceeding along the French front, were reactionary.

In the case of several equipments, reasons for comparative backwardness were well defined. Bethlehem Steel's report for 1917 disclosed a net decline of more than \$7,700,000.

Allied industrial values were under intermittent restraint, pending announcement of Washington's new peace schedule and also subject to early price revision, fortified gains of the preceding session.
