Monday Meetings in Boyd Theater Each Day Next Week, With Evangelist Dean in Charge.

Rev. John M. Dean will speak in the Boyd theater during noontime services for five days, beginning Monday. The services will be started at 12 o'clock and will continue 50 minutes, allowing time for those who must return to work at 1 o'clock.

Willard Hausmann will have charge of the musical part of the services. The main floor of the theater will be reserved for men and the balcony and boxes for women.

It is announced that attendants may come and go, according to their time and inclinations.

Rev. Mr. Dean is holding a series of special services in the First Baptist church, with which the First Christian and Westminster Presbyterian churches are co-operating. He is said to be an interesting speaker and states he will make these noontime services worth while.

At the First Congregational church Sunday morning the service will be given over to a recognition of the sad honor that has come to Omaha in the news of the death of Russell Hughes, the first soldier of the trenches from Omaha to give his life for the great cause of human liberty which has taken the American army into the field.

Rev. Fred J. Clark, the pastor of the church, is arranging a special memorial program for the occasion which will be in the nature of a tribute to Russell Hughes' worth as a brave soldier. The address to be delivered on this occasion by Rev. Mr. Clark will be an answer to the question that must inevitably come to the heart and mind of every relative of those who shall give their lives in the fierce struggle to preserve the liberties of the world. They are naturally asking "Why?" and this is the question that has stirred the souls of men ever since the world has stood.

The congregations of the First Christian, First Baptist and Westminster Presbyterian churches are planning for a great day tomorrow, when they will open the last week of the union revival services which have been in progress for the last two weeks. At 11 o'clock Evangelist Dean will preach at the First Baptist, and at 3 he will address a meeting of men only in the auditorium of the church, speaking on "The Kaiser and Martin Luther's Bible." Miss Amy Lee Stockton will at the same hour speak to a meeting of women only in the First Christian church.

At 6:30 there will be a union of the young people's societies of the three co-operating churches to be in charge of Prof. Hausmann and Miss Stockton.

At 7:45 there will be a mass meeting, when the chorus choir of 100 voices under the direction of Mr. Hausmann will lead the congregation in a service of song, to be followed by a sermon by Evangelist Dean.

Ezra Harrison, leader of the South Side Baptist church choir, is making preparations for Easter Sunday, when an elaborate musical program will be given at the evening service. Under Mr. Harrison's leadership this church has grown to be one of the largest church choirs in the city.

The revival meetings in the First Swedish Methodist church have been well attended during the last week. The evangelist, Rev. W. C. Bloomquist, will preach at 11 Sunday on "The Greatest Question for Time and Eternity," and at 8 p. m. on "Every Man a Judge." The meetings will continue next week with services every evening at 8 except Saturday. The choir, under the leadership of Howard Steberg, will be assisted by the following soloists: Mrs. Anna Renstrom, Mrs. Will Berkman and Perry Ruschla.

A two weeks' mission is given at St. Mary Magdalene's Catholic church by Father Matthew Miller and Father Isidore Dwyer, missionaries of the Passionist order. This mission will close Sunday at 7:45.

Beginning Sunday there will be a meeting every night at 8 o'clock up to and including Easter in Oak Street Methodist church. The minister will preach a short sermon each evening, commemorating the events in each day of Christ's last week. Miss Myrtle Wyatt, Mr. Danielson and Mr. Wait will furnish the special music, assisted by the junior choir of the church. Subjects of sermons: Palm Sunday, "The Day of Triumph"; Monday, "The Day of Authority"; Tuesday, "The Day of Speech"; Wednesday, "The Day of Silence"; Thursday, "The Day of Farewells"; Friday, "The Day of Suffering"; Saturday, "The Day of Rest."

Easter Sunday morning the sermon will be on "The Day of Awakening and Resurrection," and in the evening at 7 Easter concert by the Sunday school; at 8:15, a picture-sermon on "China," the fourth in a series of nine illustrated sermons given by the minister the last Sunday evening in each month.

Two hundred and fifteen men will be received into Kountze Memorial Lutheran church next week. One hundred and twenty-four, who have finished a five months' course of instruction, will be confirmed Sunday at 11 o'clock. Four soldiers are in the class. Two thousand and seven members have been received during the seven years' pastorate of Dr. O. D. Baltzy. The church has a confirmed membership of 2,407. One hundred and three young men from this church are in the country's service, the largest number from any one Lutheran church in this country. Kountze Memorial holds the record for Easter accessions for seven consecutive years.
