New York Coffee. New York, March 22.—There was more business in the market for coffee futures today and after opening unchanged to 4 points lower, prices advanced with the close unchanged to 8 points higher. There was some selling early attributed to hedging against cost and freight purchases, but trade interests were buyers later, presumably against spot business, while there was also Wall street and foreign covering. May sold up from \$1.70 to \$1.80, and September from \$1.40 to \$1.50. March, \$1.80; July, \$1.80; September, \$1.80; October, \$1.80; December, \$1.80; January, \$1.80. Spot coffee steady. Rio 7, \$1.40; Santos 48, \$1.40; no fresh offers were reported in the cost and freight market, but it was said that Brazilian shippers had accepted bids from local importers late yesterday. The official cables reported no change in primary market except Santos futures, which was unchanged to 2 1/2 cents lower. Rio exchange on London was 1.32 higher. Brazilian port receipts, 29,000 bags.
