WARD BURGESS MAN IN CAPITAL

Vanderlip Insists Omaha Man Needed in War Savings Work: Cannot Be Released for Wool Job.

Washington, April 20 .- (Special.)-Frank A. Vanderlip, chairman of the national war savings committee, and Ward M. Burgess, director of war savings for Nebraska, had dinner together here Friday night.

Mr. Vanderlip came to Washington to see Mr. Burgess about the rumor that he would take charge of the woolen branch of the dry goods and clothing division, created in the war industries board. He insisted that Mr. Burgess would be necessary to the carrying on of the war savings work in other states, and that the national war savings committee could not consider releasing Mr. Burgess from the duties of war savings work. Mr. Vanderlip proposed that Mr. Burgess devote his time for the next few weeks to visiting the other states in the union in which the war savings activity has not progressed as it has in Nebraska.

Rivalry Keen.

The rivalry between the war industries board and the national war savings committee for the services of Mr. Burgess is causing much interesting comment among those in Washington who know Mr. Burgess and are acquainted with the conspicuous success of the Nebraska war savings campaign. Mr. Burgess wired Arthur C. Smith, his business associate at Omaha, that he was disposed to

remain in the war savings work as long as he was needed there, but that he would render such assistance as he could to the war industries board, although he had not fully determined

on what course would be pursued. Letters from other state directors war savings continue to come to Mr. Burgess asking for advice on how Nebraska succeeded so remarkably, and several directors have called on him personally.


