In reply Attorney General Reed says that it is true and quotes section seven of the national act as follows:

"That none of the bends authorized by section one, nor of the certificates authorized by section five, or by sections ix, of this act, shall bear the circulation privilege. All such bonds and certificates shall be exempt, both as to principal and interest from all taxation now or hereafter imposed by the United States, any state, or any of the possessions of the United States, or by any local taxing authority, except (a) estate or inheritance taxes, and (b) graduated additional income taxes, commonly known as surtaxes, and excess profits and war profits taxes, now or hereafter imposed by the United States, upon the income or rofits of individuals, partnerships, associations, or corporations. The interest on an amount of which does not exceed in the aggregate \$5,000 owned by any individual, partnership, association, or corporation, shall be exempt, but admitted there as a condition of unrest at the hospital such that he could not pursue his work to advantage.


