
ORGANIC CHURCH UNION URGED BY PRESBYTERIANS





WRONG, FOOLISH, DECLARES DILLON

Dublin, May 21 .- John Dillon, the nationalist leader, in an interview with the Associated Press correspondent today, emphasized the divergence between his party and the Sinn Fein, whose policy he declared to be "wrong and foolish and bound to end in disaster.'

Mr. Dillon said he still believed in a friendly settlement with Great Britain. He adhered to the declara-tion of the late John E. Redmond, made at the outbreak of the war, that the "cause of the allies is the cause of freedom.

In an appeal to the American people, Mr. Dillon said that the Sinn Fein had been supplied with unlimited financial resources from New York and he urgently asked all those of support his party as against the Sinn Fein.


