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BATTERY ERRORS CAUSE DOWNFALL OF CHAMPIONS

Omaha Owes Much to Lynch and Lewellyn for Part in Defeat of Des Moines.

Des Moines, June 27.—(Special Telegram.)—Battery errors by Lynch and Lewellyn led to the Boosters' downfall in the third game of the series with Omaha tonight, the Nebraska taking an exciting 2 to 0 game that the locals had every chance in the world to annex.

The champions, however, were unable to hit the ball safely when men were perched on the bags waiting to count, and were unable to score a single run off the slants of wily Otto Merz. Twice when a safe knock would have tied the score the Des Moines batter drove a line drive at a hungry infielder, who gobbled it for a double play. Merz was a complete puzzle to the Boosters until the fifth inning, when Hunter procured the first hit off him a double in center field.
