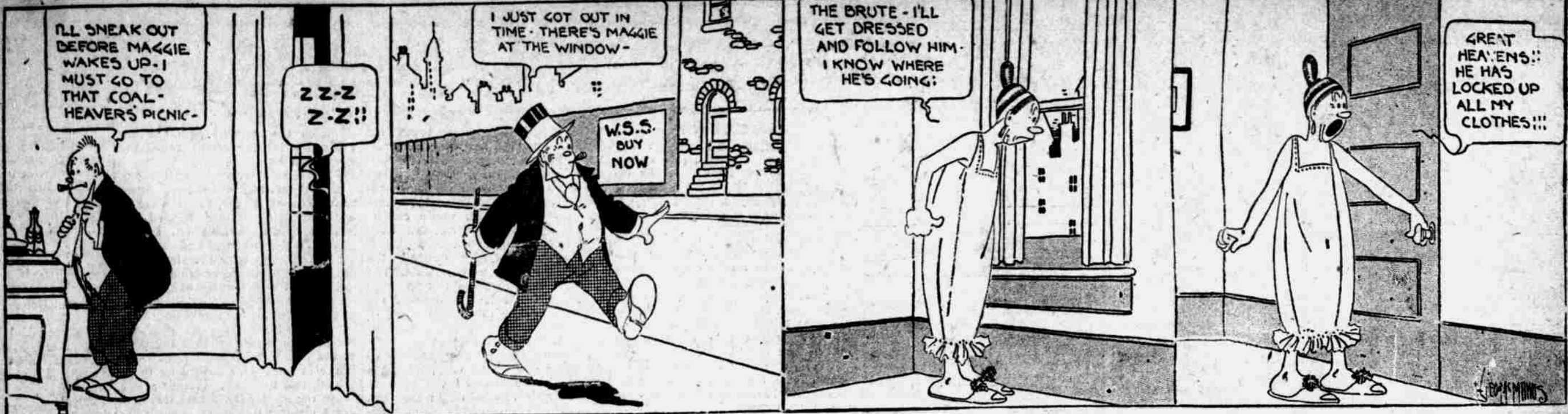

### ROURKES DIVIDE DOUBLE-HEADER WITH SIOUX CITY

Outstanding Features Are Multiplicity of Pitchers and Abundant Errors, and Plenty of Base Hits.

Sioux City, Ia., June 30.—(Special Telegram.)—Omaha and Sioux City split a double hit today, both of the games being one-sided affairs. In the first game the locals loomed, while Omaha batsmen were driving the ball about the park at will. The fact that the Omaha team is credited with two errors does not indicate that their fielding was not good, for they put up one of the snappiest fielding games seen here this year. No chance seemed too difficult for them. The outstanding fielding feature of the day was Defate's leaping open-handed catch of a liner off Thomason's bat in the second game, but Rourke's men pulled many stunts that showed class. In the second game the Omaha pitchers got away to a bad start and Sioux City reversed the stick work conditions. Added to this, Omaha's defense crumpled up at critical times and the team had no chance to overcome the lead taken by the Sioux in the first inning. Umpire Shannon was punctured by two directly batted foul balls, but he finished the games.
