Prices Stiffen in Cattle Market; Hogs Continue to Show Slump; Drop Twenty to Thirty Cents.

Omaha, July 27, 1918.

Cattle—There was the usual very moderate Saturday's run in cattle today, about 750 head, and the market was nominally steady.

Anything in the way of either forced or grass beef sold readily at strong prices anywhere from 25c to 30c higher than a week ago.

Cows and heifers were in very indifferent request and slow sale at about Friday's basis, or anywhere from 25c to 50c lower than a week ago.

Stockers and feeders were pretty well cleaned up, although the volume of business for the week was comparatively light.

Prices were higher than a week ago all along the line for both stock cattle and feeding steers and prospects are favorable for increased receipts and a broader demand the coming week.
