

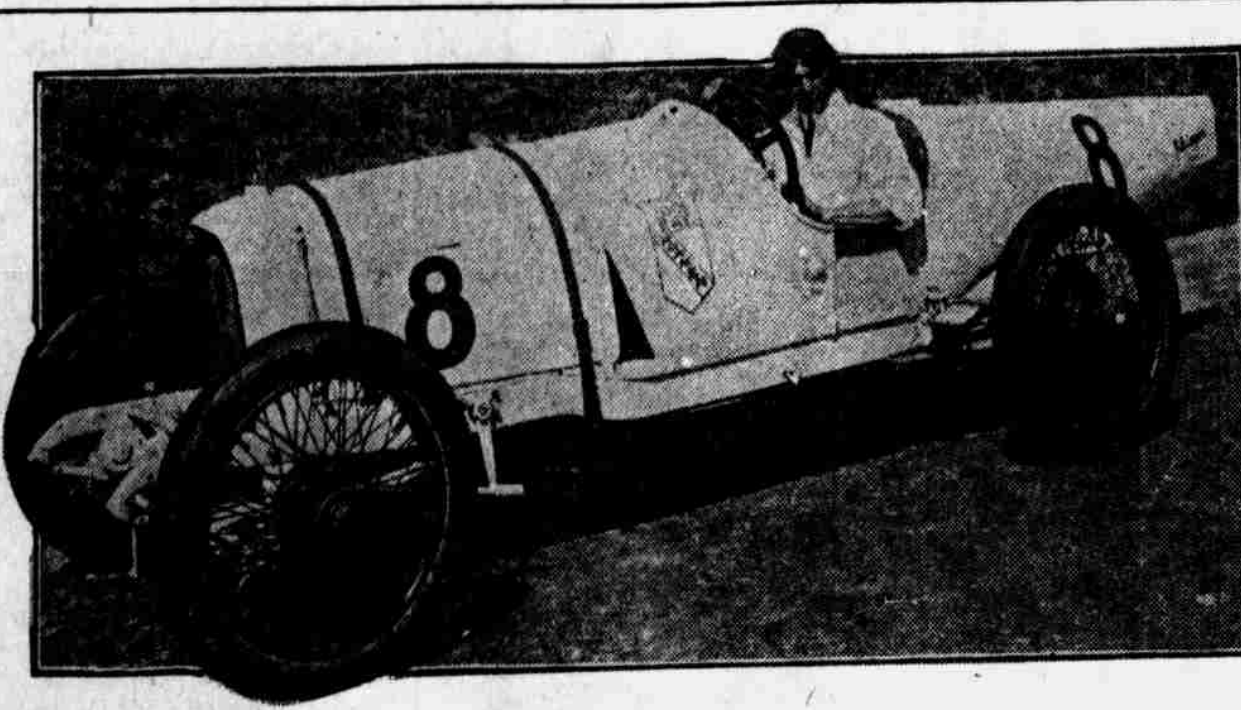


BURR LAMPKIN BIG WINNER IN MOTOR SPRINTS

COOK OF BLAIR IS STAR OF TOURNEY PITCHING SHOES

Many Engage in Contest at Fontenelle Park Before an Enthusiastic Gallery.

Guy Cook of Blair, better known as "Butch," in the Washington county metropolis, is "some baby" at horse shoe pitching, as he demonstrated Sunday afternoon during a championship tournament held in Fontenelle park under municipal auspices.

"Butch" Cook is concededly the star horse shoe player of Washington county, and now he intends to annex Douglas county to his domains. Tonight at 7 o'clock in Fontenelle park, he and his mate will be matched in the third elimination round.

"When they telephoned to me at Blair Saturday and told me they were going to play 45 feet between stakes, I nearly decided not to go, but I did not want to disappoint the boys, so I went down. I practiced some between loads of grain at the elevator on a 45-foot throw. You know, the American association rules provide for 38 1/2 feet, and I told the boys down here that 45 feet is not according to association rules." Butch Cook stated between throws.

George Anthes, 62 years old, was the dean of the players. City Commissioner Falconer and Superintendent Isaacson of the public recreation department supervised the tournament.
